There are seven orchestras and conductors: Philharmonia, 75 musicians, Susan Oftedahl, conductor; Sinfonia, 65, Karen Olsen; Repertory West, 65, Barbara Flooding; Repertory Northeast, 90, Ed Schaefle and John Madura; Concert Orchestra, 75, Paul Ousley; Philharmonic, 65, James Berg; Symphony, 80, Paul Jan Zdunek.

Symphony concert dates began on Sunday, November 15. The Celebrity Series continues on Sunday, April 18, 7:30 P.M. at the Cathedral of St. Paul with "Opera Goes to Church" featuring the Minnesota Opera Chorus and resident artists, Jorja

Fleezanis, violin. On Sunday June 6, 7:00 P.M. at Benson Great Hall, Bethel College, the "Symphony Farewell Concert from the New World" takes place. In June 1999, the Symphony will tour Eastern Europe in Warsaw, Krakow, Prague, Vienna and Budapest.

Winter auditions take place January 9. The concerto competition is on January 16. 1999 Audition dates will be May 5-8 and May 12-15.

Concerto competitions take place in October; one winner plays as soloist with the symphony.
