New Music Reading Clinic 1999

Thirty-six orchestra teachers fromAlbert Lea to Moorhead, from Duluth to Brandon South Dakota, met at Valley View Middle School in Edina on August 23 to evaluate over 100 string orchestra pieces. The folders were supplied by the National Office of ASTA WITH NSOA.

We read through part or all of each piece, beginning at 9:00 A.M. and continuing till 4:00 P.M., under the bat on of various volunteers from the group. During the day, many orchestra members switched instruments for variety—often the most useful (and sometimes humorous) view of a new piece is from the perspective of a student who is not an expert on a particular instrument. We were well-fed during breaks by snacks and lunch from Edina's best caterers, thanks to host Barb Flooding.

If you missed this year's reading session, be sure to plan to attend next year! It's a great way to preview lots of new music, to get your brain in gear for the school year, and to visit with lots of other string teachers.

We informally rated each piece as to its quality. The standard disclaimer: our ratings were necessarily colored by the fact that we each were evaluating each piece based on its appropriateness for the students *we* teach. Recognizing this bias, our top picks of the music we read included pieces that (a) sound good, (b) have interesting parts for all instruments, and (c) teach important concepts. There is something here for your group!
