At his second session, we were actively involved in preparing scale fingerings and then trying them out on each instrument. Scale Olympics is wonderful. He also talked of a scale competition as a possible semester project for which there would be several non-threatening judges brought in to evaluate the students. Getting all students involved with scales in class was another key point Hinkie made. Have the tonic of a scale played by one or two sections of the orchestra and have the other students play the scale above that. What a great way to get

students to listen and be aware of his or her own tuning within the orchestra!
